The five parts of Aquatic Diptera were originally published as four Memoirs (164, 177, 205, and 210) of the Cornell University Agricultural Experiment Station in 1934, 1935, 1937, and 1937, respectively. This edition is an unabridged facsimile reprint of the original works.

The Culicidae, including the chaoborids and dixids, are treated in the first part, pages 34-48.

It has been 12 years since the appearance of the last review of the genus Deinocerites. In that time, much material and information have accumulated on the species of this very interesting genus. Recent studies have shown one species to be naturally infected with the viruses of St. Louis encephalitis and of Venezuelan equine encephalomyelitis. These factors have led to the production of this publication. Eighteen species are treated, of which 16 are known in all stages.
