ANNUAL REPORT 1951-52

We are happy to report that a great deal of work has been accomplished toward basically improving the grounds of the Arboretum during this past year.

CONSTRUCTION:

County Capital Improvement work on the grounds of the Arboretum during the current fiscal year has consisted of somewhat over \$103,000 worth of contracts let last June 1951, from the 1950-51 capital improvement budget. The work consisted of major drainage facilities, paving of the central roadways, tree and debris removal, and central area sprinkler system.

During this current fiscal year the Honorable Board of Supervisors of the County of Los Angeles has let contracts approximating \$130,000.00. This work consists of grading the rest of the major road system in the north acres and on Tallac Knoll, filling of land to be reclaimed in the southeast corner of the Arboretum, drainage in the north acres, and on the southeast side of the Arboretum, dead tree removal, water main and sewage line in north acres, grading of future building sites, and the construction of lath house units. The work has been in accordance with the Foundation's Master Plan for the Arboretum.

BALDWIN AVENUE:

Future permanent access to the Arboretum grounds according to the Master Plan has passed its most critical milestone during this past year. Through the magnificent work of the County Board of Supervisors, and in particular Honorable Herbert C. Legg, Baldwin Avenue has become an accomplished fact. The Trustees of the Arboretum Foundation are in-

deed grateful for the wonderful cooperation of the County Board of Supervisors, Arcadia City Officials and residents of Arcadia, and to the County Road Department for the splendid job done in bringing Baldwin Avenue into reality.

HORTICULTURAL PROGRAM:

Accessions of new plants and seeds at the Arboretum totaled 1870 for the fiscal year. Among seed obtained were several outstanding collections from Australia, South Africa, Puerto Rico, Java, and Argentina.

A fine collection of Orchid plants, including 227 accessions, was received from Mrs. Lucille Rawleigh Meyer of Bel Air.

Approximately 1500 trees have been planted in permanent position. Among these were planted a large number of *Acacia* and *Eucalyptus* groups which have made excellent growth this first year.

There are some 10,000 plants ready to go into permanent plantings this coming fall, which will appreciably dress up the appearance of portions of the grounds where capital improvement work has been completed.

Field nursery trial areas have been considerably expanded and include a number of plants of promise for extensive use in Southern California.

The addition to the Foundation of the Lux Arboretum Annex, in Monrovia, through donation by Dr. G. P. Lux has considerably expanded our horticultural facilities and wealth of plant materials. Over 1100 United States Department of Agriculture introductions alone have been gathered together over the past 35 years

by Dr. Lux. In addition to these introductions, there are countless other items which Dr. Lux has been bringing together for many years.

Maintenance of these collections, their labeling and accessioning will considerably add to the responsibility of the Arboretum and to its enrichment of plant materials.

RESEARCH PROGRAM:

A. The Arboretum this year has two separate research agreements with the County of Los Angeles:

1. Resolution by County Board of Supervisors adopted September 25, 1951: Research investigation, introduction, propagation, growing, testing and demonstration of trees and shrubs suitable for use in parks, and center, side and intersectional panels of road rights-of-way. A special effort to be made to locate and recommend trees and shrubs for the above purposes, which will withstand summer droughts and require a minimum of maintenance. Dissemination through publication of such cultural information acquired through this research study as shall be of benefit to the County of Los Angeles. \$34,000.00.

2. Resolution by County Board of Supervisors adopted December 11, 1951: Research investigation, introduction, propagation, growing, testing, and demonstration of heavy duty, drought resisting, evergreen turf grasses and soil binding plants suitable for use in and around County golf courses, playgrounds, athletic fields, parks, and institutional buildings. Planting material of potential value to be furnished insofar as is available for large scale practical testing at County properties.

Dissemination through publication of such cultural information acquired through this research study as shall be of benefit to the County of Los Angeles. \$22,600.00.

B. During March 1952, California Arboretum Foundation signed an agreement with Monsanto Chemical Company for the purpose of testing "Krilium Soil Conditioner" in our soils from the standpoint of use by the home gardener. For this testing program at the Arboretum, Monsanto is contributing the amount of \$12,320.00; the program to run from March 12, 1952 to March 11, 1953.

CO-OPERATIVE RESEARCH AGENCIES:

1. Division of Plant Exploration and Introduction, U. S. D. A., furnishes potential cortisone-producing plants for

test in our area, as well as many other foreign plants of potential ornamental value for our area.

2. U. S. Soil Conservation Service, San Fernando, cover cropping plants and *Eucalyptus* species.

3. U. S. Forest Service, plants for erosion control and drought resistance.

4. Los Angeles County Flood Control District, has furnished instruments for the recording of official weather data: i.e.—rainfall, Max.-Min. temperature and evaporation.

5. Department of Pharmacy, University of Southern California, growing of certain Solanaceae for strategic alkaloid analysis.

6. California State Highway Department, mutual testing of plants for future freeway plantings.

7. Botany Department, U. C. L. A., mutual exchange of surplus plant materials for comparative growth potentialities in two specifically different areas within Los Angeles County.

8. New York Botanical Garden, growth tests of high cortisone yielding clones of *Strophanthus*.

9. Los Angeles County Park Department, testing of suitable trees, shrubs and turfs for this area.

LIBRARY:

Until facilities are available for proper housing of library books, our growth has been very limited. We are, however, indebted to our many members and friends for generous donations of valuable books and pamphlets. This year we have been able to place our catalogue system into operation. The library is now largely catalogued, complete with author and subject card files.

The library continues to build up its receipt of domestic and foreign Botanical and Horticultural publications through exchange for the Foundation's publication "Lasca Leaves."

HISTORICAL COMMITTEE — RESTORATION:

The Historical Committee, under the very active guidance of Mrs. Richard Y. Dakin, raised sufficient funds from private donations to actively commence the restoration program early this spring. The first of our historical buildings undergoing restoration is the "Lucky" Baldwin Casino. Mr. Maurice Block is directing this restoration. It is intended that by the spring of 1953 this building and its adjacent garden shall have been restored to its former splendor.

GROUP TOURS OF THE ARBORETUM:

This year more than 3000 individuals visited the Los Angeles State and County Arboretum on personally conducted educational tours, in parties ranging from ten to groups of over one-hundred.

On the tours, Mr. Nelson gave a brief history of colorful old Rancho Santa Anita, an elucidation of the past expansion of the Arboretum, the present work now

in progress and an explanation of the future development and use of the property.

These groups were Garden Clubs, Girl Scouts, Boy Scouts, Blue Bird Girls, Cub Scouts, Brownies, School Classes, Women's Clubs, Audubon Societies and miscellaneous groups; totaling 88 groups in all. In addition to these groups, approximately twenty-six hundred people visited the Arboretum during the three day Garden Tour in June.
