

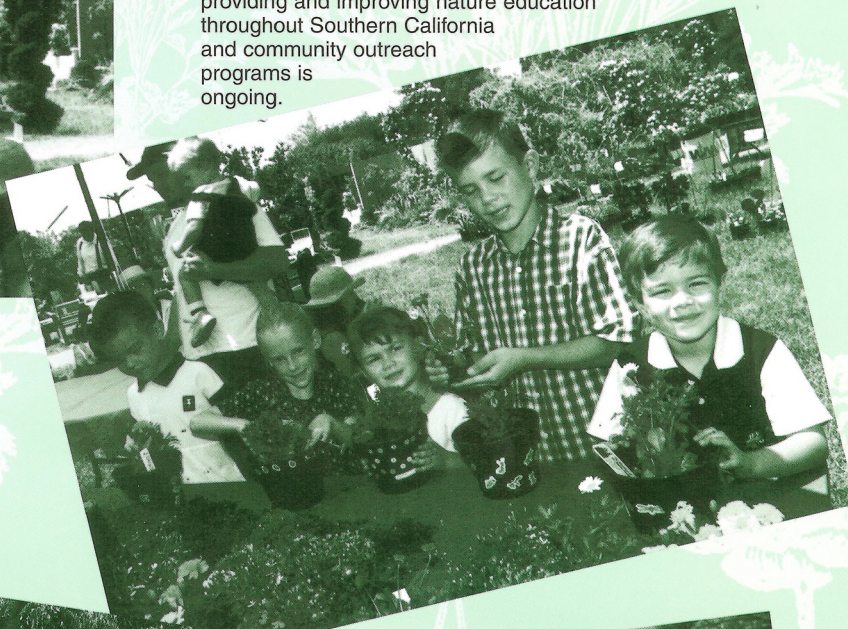
2001-2002 Goals

There are several goals for the coming year that will continue to enhance The Arboretum grounds plant collection and education programs.



Increased participation in organizations such as Partners in Nature Education (PINE) dedicated to providing and improving nature education throughout Southern California and community outreach programs is ongoing.

Plant labeling and interpretive signage will be a focus in the coming year with ethnobotany becoming a central theme to the signage. In addition, updating of the plant records database through ongoing mapping activities will continue.



Redevelopment of the wickiups and Tongva/Gabrielino heritage site adjacent to the adobe courtyard is planned.



The preservation of The Arboretum's early California historical buildings, including the Hugo Reid Adobe, is a focus for the coming year. Fund raising to ensure their long-term presence is underway.

Increased efforts towards a "Least Toxic Best Practices" approach to cultivation will include mulching, organic weed abatement and fertilizing programs, greenwaste composting and conversion of 20% of the Arboretum to automated irrigation.
