The South Bay Herb Society held their annual meeting and membership drive at the garden on Sunday September 24 (memberships are available at any time for \$3 per year).

Birds observed on the September bird walk included: California quail, cliff swallow, black phoebe, scrub jay, song sparrow, loggerhead shrike, house finch, brown towhee.

Plants now in bloom are: Buddejua Colvilei, Abelia grandiflora, Hibiscus "President", Vitex chinensis and negundo, Solanum rantonnetii (Paraguay Nightshade), Odontospermum sericeum, Crocosmia masonotum, Polygala apopetala. Prunus cerasifera is also blooming, although this is a rather unusual time for it to do so.
