#### RESEARCH DIVISION

Welcome to Dr. Wayne Loescher, our new staff member (Plant Physiologist) at the Research Division, starting May 1st. Dr. Loescher is filling the biologist position vacated by Bob Gonderman's retirement last December. He was born in Lima, Ohio and finished his doctor's degree in plant physiology and bio-chemistry at Iowa State University in 1971. He was selected from among sixteen applicants for the biologist position due to his experience and interest in plant cell development and plant tissue culture. Following his graduation he worked for two years as a postdoctorate research fellow at Iowa State on a project to obtain a hybrid between corn and sorghum. His major duty here will be the study of vegetative propagation of difficultto-root ornamental woody species. Emphasis will be on the improvement of tissue culture techniques on woody species, not only for the purpose of facilitating the problem of vegetative propagation but also in the hope of broadening the genetic manipulation of ornamental woody plants. Dr. Loescher is married; his wife, Judith, has a doctor's degree in phycology (study of algae).
