The project of Armillaria root-rot control by the use of pressure injectors and the chemical cycloheximide, has received some financial help. The Upjohn Company, manufacturer of cycloheximide, will donate about three hundred dollars worth of the chemical for our field plot treatment. Furthermore, through contact with Mr. William J. Griffin, President, Western Chapter, of the International Shade Tree Conference, Inc., we have recently received a check of one-thousand dollars given by Madame Gauna Walska of Santa Barbara for the Armillaria project. This money will assist us greatly in managing these field experiments which will begin next spring.

#### ARBORETUM DIVISION

The service is being provided by the County Health Department without charge to any employee who would like to take advantage of the offer.
