But there is also another object, which I must claim from your friendship: a critical review on the northamerican Palmae and their geographical distribution. I am totally incapable of determining these plants, as you have seen from my treating Sabal and Copernicia and Thrinax so aphoristically. Therefore I beg you, to communicate me your knowledge.

For your directives allow me, to put here such species as I believe that they could come into your consideration, as growing in one or the other part of Northamerica (Texas inclosed).
