- ✓ Arenaria Groenlandica, Sprng. on shores as well as mountain summits (frequent)
- ✓ Trifolium agrarium, L. well established Mt. Desert
- ✓ Potentilla Pennsylvanica L. Mt. Desert
- ✓ Rubus Chamaemorus, L. Mt. Desert
- ✓ Rosa nitida, R. lucida, R. Carolina, all abundant)
- ✓ Sedum Rhodiola. DC. Mt. Desert
- ✓ Rhexia Virginica, L. Mt. Desert
- ✓ Aster hindleyanus T & G. Mt. Desert
- ✓ Utricularia gibba, L. Mt. Desert (F. M. Day)
- ✓ Bartonia tenella, Muhl mountain summit 1500 ft! Mt. Desert
- ✓ Corenopsis Conradii, Torr. Mt. Desert (Redfield; Rand) Goldsborough Me. (Redfield)
