My Dear Dr Gray. I return herewith Dr
J. D. Hooker's letter for use of which I am much
obliged. That man has not since put in an
appearance. And if he does you will see from this
"blue print" scrap that I am prepared for him.

On same scrap I have taken a thin Shieback which
has a certain bearing on your previous paper over the
Mehan hickory nuts. I am making these things now
so that they can be electrotyped (or Lenticular) right
from the glass negative. And so save cost and
inaccuracy of engraving. Of course the work is not
so artistic but it has manifest advantages which
will become greater as the process is more developed—

The fungal genus which was suggested for me, I found
on the leaves of a Magnolia at Brandon, Va.
It is a remarkable thing. but so dreadfully
small that, when pointed out, one must look again
and again to see it - In fact it is smaller
than my aspirations. So I'll hold on to the Ascepterias
if you think it a good genus.
