I collected about 50 species - more as keepsakes, than for their rarity. I will send you a set of them in a few days. We went up the St. Johns River as far as "Enterprise" - a small place, - consisting of half a dozen houses & a tolerable hotel. Here we spent several days - there was good botanizing close at hand. There were plenty of alligators in the river. A German merchant of N.Y. erected a large of limestone house near Enterprise, that he might have a place of his own for a winter retreat. He was very kind to us, & drove us in his nice carriage about the country - preparing us to spend a week or two with him. Here we saw whole forests of palmettos, some of them 60 ft. high. Going down the river, we stopped at Jacksonville,

where we staid a Sunday & several other days. Here I botanized when the thermometer was 84° in the shade - Then we went to Tallahassee - where they had the kindst weather. Here we remained 5 days. Saw Green's monument to the front of his Church. Next we went back to Gainesville for 2d. and days of 10 standing here. Found by then Maggie gone & taken ill. but don't about Merriam & Cooke in my next - very busy
