My Dear Sir,

I have your favor of 7<sup>th</sup> inst., and have sent you as requested an additional 5 copies of my Contributions X. at price 30 cents each - you can charge such price as you think right. I should prefer that my account be kept distinct from that with Dr. Gray, if you do not object - though it is not of much consequence. The "Botany of California", the "Index", and my "Contributions" are all my personal matter, with which Dr. Gray has nothing to do, and it would avoid possible complications if the account could be made separate. All items that concern the Herbarium should be referred to his account. Under present regulations, however, all orders for Herbarium purchases will be made through Mr. Winsor and filled by his agent in Germany.
