To Prof Asa Gray.

Dr Sir, Will you please accept these seeds of "Tuckermania" which I gathered (fully ripe I believe) from the original plant first seen by Nuttall "on sheltering rocks, near the sea, San Diego." This plant grew in just that position in 1866, that is, on Point Loma, in the only locality that can answer to the above language. There are no 'sheltering rocks' on the Coast near San Diego except on Pt. Loma, where the Light House stands. It would give me pleasure to know that they were flourishing in your Botanic Garden - The foliage and whole herbage is of a bright yellowish green and partially translucent. The flowers are the perfection of 'golden yellow'. I hope these seeds will prove good.

The seeds of Darlingtoria which I also send were collected by Dr Goodale of Portland Me. from the same locality which I visited where the plants were

in flower. Dr. G. saw them 4 weeks after.

The seeds of *Lathyrus maritimus* I send
merely that you may (if they grow) compare
them with Dr Bigelow's plant. It is abundant
in the lower Counties of Cal. from Los Ang.
down - Flowers very brilliant - and attract
much attention from the inhabitants.

Excuse me for saying this much, or
perhaps you have already so many of these
plants in the Garden as to render my little
contribution worthless, and require an apol-
ogy from me for sending them.

Should you make use of them, however,
I should be glad to learn 'by and by' of the
results.
