My Dear Mr. Watson -
Replying to yours of the 20th I
would say that I can wait for Prof. Vordane to arrange
to lay out his plants, & as long as I get the money from him
somewhere about the 15th to 20th of Dec. it will satisfy me.
We have had only one frost here & that not very severe as it did not
kill the heliotrope. What we need mostly here now is rain to
fill up the streams. Is there nothing from my garden that you
want either for yourself or the Botanic Garden? If there is

all you have to do is to say so & I shall be only too happy
to send it. Have you any Clematis paniculata growing? It is the
finest bushy sort I have ever tried. The strongest shrubs are
grown by grafting it on C. flans. I have the new(?) Clematis
Adamsii which Mr. Wigg sent me from the Blue Ridge & it
has stood our winter perfectly.
