pollen & 3 stigmas: I have
counted & felt bud above
90 flowers, trying all 18
dissected which are 18 pollen
crosses within limits of this one

species! I cannot explain, but I feel
sure you will think it grand
case. — I have been writing to
B. Smith, to see if I & Spill can
get *L. hypoxipha*, & it has
just fledged on me that you
might have *Syllium* in h.
^{& I have looked to you} ^{meant} for the love of flowers
America. —
have a look at some of your
species, & if you can get me
seed, so: I want much to
try species with few stations, if
they are dimorphic: I suspect
verticality. I sh^d expect to be
trimorphic. Seed! Seed! Seed!
