It appears to have originated  
with Raulffs in some observations  
in Mathews "Andes of Peru" but  
we do not have that work in  
our Library (Mass Hort. Soc.) and  
I cannot ascertain the date of  
publication. If you do not  
have that work at Cambridge  
you will find the name cited  
in Willdenow's Species Fil. or Pl.  
I think.

I want to find out which is  
the earliest name C. scariosa<sup>R.P.</sup> or  
C. elegans Desv. I now

more than suspect that Baker's judgment from some of Lemmmis' specimens was not far from right in calling them Scariozae and that Ehrn was also correct in calling his specimen Myciophylla, since some of Pringle's recent collections run nearer to Scarioza than any of Lemmmis do - the only difference that I can see between them and your Cambridge specimens of Scarioza is that in the latter the scales are more copiously ciliolate and almost spring on the sides, but that is ~~a~~ only a difference of degree in variation to which I attach little or no importance - and as other of his specimens are clearly C. elegans it looks to me as if this was another one of those cases in which

two or three species will have to be merged into one. Should this prove to be the case here it will be only a question of priority of names between C. Scarioza and elegans.

Unfortunately the former name would lose its application as it passed into the latter's domain while the latter would be equally appropriate for all the forms.

I have decided, after another examination, to give the California plant I mentioned to you under the name of Carex fibrilloosa as a variety of C. Campestris. It comes near enough to that species to be so disposed of for the present, and I am decidedly averse to multiplying dubious and juggling species in this coquettish genus.
