Dear Doctor

I have never attempted
to collect "Cartes". My collection exstra-
cer beside Prof. Lincoln & Drs. Sartwell
& Robbins, & Oliver & Wright — only eleven,
all Lichenists. Recalling several, it
occurred to me that I should like all
the lichenologists — but Lyell had
preferred to give me an exceedingly
decrepit head of Montagne — and
two others, to whom I applied, gave
me nothing — so I tried no more.

This accounts for my never having
asked a copy of one of your pictures.
If you will let it share a place
in my very humble gallery — I shall
be much pleased to have it, and,
as you suggest, in more than one
form. And I am glad to send
you what is considered a good
one of myself.

I heard from Fries lately (4 Nov.
1860) when he appeared to be well
though calling himself old & only
able to enjoy botany in point.

I shall be happy to get
Engelmann's Junci by Expus:—
but feel that I have done
very little to deserve a copy:

His labour was great in
settling some of his conclusions;
& it shall try to settle my
Amherst species, when I get
the herbarial collection.

My Genera of Lichens is in
its last chapter — but the
revision may be in itself a
considerable work — as I have
included a good deal of
matter which belongs rather
to a "Report on your Species"
or this I may exclude: suppose
I ought to. I wished to
make at the same time with
my Exposé or systematic view, a

Report on what is known in
all the more difficult — or
nearly the larger part of our
Lichen Flora, & this has cost
time & space — though the
long talks on the changes
I have proposed in the
Arrangement took up enough.

As soon as this first book,
is done I will at once go
at a book of Species in some
form — & shd like also to give
a series of popular articles,
with Plates, — application for
which has been made by the
Editor of the Naturalist. If I can
get the drawings made right,
this may be a useful work,
& it will give me a chance
to support, in figures, my views
of the System.
