Dear Mr. Watson

Your letter was forwarded to me here and
I thank you much for your information.

I have made extensive collections here this
year but have nothing new as far as I can see
but I have secured fine specimens of *Arabis Drummondii*
both in flower and fruit. The latter at 6900 feet altitude
the former at 8500 feet. Both obtained the same day.
It is a remarkably fine species and quite distinct
from the eastern *A. Coffeyi*. I think I have a
small *Ranunculus* not found before in our mountains.

My son is with Dr. Dawson at Amalaska
and the Pribiloff Islands in Behring's Sea this year
and I expect a number of northern things from his
collections when he returns. He is a famous collector
so I expect some additions to the flora of these islands
when he gets back. I will be home in a month.
