My experience with him is however (confi-
dentially to speak) not very encouraging,
and the calumniation in his writings against
Linnaeus, who treated him when in England
with the utmost kindness, is much to
be lamented.

I try to have care of the cartoon
notes, one for Mr. Wright, the other for
a gentleman who promised to send *Wrightia*
plants, which he had collected in a *str-*
germanis capacity: Do you know any
thing of him and the value of his col-
lections?

My dear Mr. Gray,

The new *Laba* plants are safe in my
hands: I had been very anxious whether
they had not been injured, the Bremen
storm by which they came having had
a passage of unparalled stormy weather,
but I am glad to say, that they are
as good as new. As you learn to myself
to fix the price, I shall make the
same calculation as with respect to the
last collection, but then doubtful whether
with respect to the money-market it
is better for Mr. Wright to pay American
dollars or Prussian Thalers, and I expect
only your answer to pay Mr. Heding
at Hamburg.

I hope to give you a welcome
and in telling you, that Dr. Hooker
has had the great liberality of presenting
me with the whole stock of *Impatiens*
of the *Wrightian* flora, so that I
can now offer you the first number
of the collections to be formed for *British*
botany. And as I must select the

quarant myself, I am rather afraid
to begin with it: there are about twenty
large bundles. As soon as I have some
leaves to do it, I may send them and
ask whether it is convenient to address
the parcel directly to you by a German
steamer. If you have plants to distrib-
ute, for instance of *Willdenowia* capricornis
or the new Rocky mountain plants, remind
me, but there is no hurry about it.

I had lately the pleasure of seeing
here one of your colleagues, Mr. Christ,
but he was here only a single day.

The written catalogue of Wright's
plants is highly welcome, and chiefly
the corrections to some of my last
determinations. I have now been again
the second volume of DeCandolle's Flora from
the Berlin library, and that is my
attempt to identify his species, when
writing the list of the new-known
Cuban plants. Do you wish to have
by and by the definitive name of
such numbers as are still blank or
the determination of which I have
to make a remark? Sometimes the

discrepancy is due to misplacing of num-
bers, as I have formerly found by comparing
Lindley's numbers of *Orchids* with my own. In
looking now over the catalogue, I find for
instance no. 2284 = *Amygdalis maritima*, while
my number 292 (said to be the same) is
a new *Thoninia*, called *Th. puberula*.

I have now begun with *Euphorbiaeae*,
and give you as a specimen my *Schumacheria*.
