Tremontia Californica, intended
through your kindness for my

interesting to try the plant (if
we are happy enough to raise
it) in the ground at Mortola,

but we will make a sowing
here also.

I have been gathering this
afternoon seeds of Terula glauca
L., of which a very handsome
plant flowered under a south
wall in the garden here. It
may be a commonish thing,
but I venture to enclose a
few of the seeds, - with the
regret however that I have

nothing better to offer. ~
