Dear Mr. Watson,

Your letter
reached me this evening.
Mr. Allen is right
about his fungus. It is
Elaphomyces granulatus,
one of the *Tuberaceae*.

Rostopinski's genus
Oligonema is about
15 years old. It is one of
the *Myxomycetes* near
Perichaena. It is quite
impossible to keep track
of all the modern genera
of fungi and algae. *Cladotrix*
Farlow

which has been kept in
the Manual has, for rather
more than 20, been used
to denote a genus of Schiz-
omycetes named by Cohn
who did not know of
Muttall's name. The Cohn
name is still kept up in
books written this year.
I know no genus *Golionema*.

I suppose that you have
received my letter from here.
I am at work on figures
of fungi but unfortunately
there are fewer fungi this
year than I have ever seen
in the Mountain which
is a serious hindrance to
my work. I will write
to Mr. Allen tonight,
