

Wilmington Nov. 11<sup>th</sup> 1882

My Dear Dr. Gray,

We have been very  
much grieved to hear of your accident though  
a note from Mr. Watson received this morning,  
and sincerely hope that you have not and will  
not suffer very much from it. Mr. Watson  
says that it will delay your work a little but  
you must not think of that as a loss. Mr. Smith  
wrote me that he felt, from the tone of your  
note to him, that you were unscathed. If this  
accident does not give you much pain or  
does not result in permanent injury it may  
be a blessing. Somewhere I have read that Pres-  
cott, after accomplishing one of his works, always  
did some "literary loafing". If you only knew how  
to "loaf"! From personal experience I can recommend  
it as being perfectly delightful.

After you are well enough to travel would not a

journey this way do you good. It would be a great delight to see you and Mr. Hay Lee. The weather will probably be charming here for some time yet and the country is still very pretty.

You will be pained to hear, that day before yesterday I met Rutherford in Phila. with both hands tied up. He had become blood-poisoned while performing an operation and told me that he had been making necessary arrangements at the University and was going home to go to bed. I could not help thinking of poor Dr. Cushing and what a time he had in the same way. But I do hope Rutherford's trouble may not be serious.

Mrs. Cauly sends her warm sympathy with and regards for you and Mr. Hay in which I heartily join.
