

Wilmington Sept. 9th 1886

My Dear Dr. Gray

We are grieved that you cannot carry out your plan of coming here and feel the disappointment all the more because we had so confidently counted upon it; but we will keep up hope for the future.

As you will not be here to look over them I will send the *Portulaca* near to Cambridge by Express in a day or two. The specimens of *Buaya* (taken at the same time) are better than those of Braudage. There is a little plant with the larger ones.

Mr. Leachy sends his kindest regards. She has, with rare exceptions, given up reading and writing, feeling the necessity of rest more than ever but still has pretty

right.

I suppose you have known how
sick Rotherick has been though now
much better.
