Yours of the 8th is in hand. You may say to Prof. Sargent that it will afford me pleasure to aid in the furtherance of his enterprise. It is not hinted at the No. of representative types nor the number of each species desired. I feel some at a loss to take the responsibility of forwarding so late this season. Should they get through without being thawed in the Sun after freezing they might do better than your spring which does not connect or coincide so well with yours.

For the most part plants raised on the spot I think would outgrow the imported in the long run.

I shall at all events take upon myself to send a small venture forthwith so far as the snow & rains will allow me to collect.
