

San Francisco Dec. 28th 1872

Prof. Gray

Dear Sir

I sent a lot of seed to Prof. Sargent and I of Box of Forest Trees among them find two seedlings of what to me appears to be novel shrub (?) I have red berries on it — Can it be a Strutella that I have not seen? I think I have a sp. of a new Myrtle — no fls. nor fruit — shall get both another season — if you like I'll send this — it may be you would recognize this or something else for which I mistake it in my conjecture.

I send herein a few sp. from Colorado — some I recognize others I do not — if convenient let me know, and any thing you wish I may be able to get for you.

Enclosed see a few hasty remarks or hints relative to our bulbs &c.
