Strikes in England.

We are not paying sufficient attention in this country, to the effects which the strikes of the English workmen will produce. They may shake the whole substratum of English prosperity more strongly than a Russian war could do. More than 70,000 operatives have left labor. Some are weavers, and some the workmen of the coal regions. Any attempt to induce them to return to labor at their old prices has hitherto been ineffectual. To coerce them by an exhibition of military strength would only result in loss on both sides, without accomplishing anything. If they return to their work, the price of labor must be higher than it has been, thus giving some advantage to our operatives. If they migrate to Australia or go to other employments, there is just so much lost to the real effect ive power of England's manufactories.
