My Dear Mr. James

I have had an interview with Garrison, and have arranged terms on which he will bring out the works. - the printing to be done in Cambridge, either at the Riverside or Wilbur's Press.

I have a form of written agreement from Garrison, which, however, needs some alteration. - You to furnish drawings for the new plates. - & he will have it engraved on copper. He pays all expenses of getting out, gives you 50 copies. - & then sells remainder of a first ed. of 750 to recover his expenses, - pays copy-right

at rate to be settled, on
all copies sold after that.
I hope does this strike
you?
