4 new genera African plants,

quarters. It is a great comfort

of the Griffith and Holper Herbarium
is printing - a great help it will
be to me to whom time is so scarce
as to me, and no one to help me,
except a mere glorer. I admire
your industry and zeal, How full
your hands must be!

A lot of bark plants will soon
go to New York from here. As a Cambridge
part of ~~them~~ have already been studied

by Grisebach, their determinations may be
expected to be published soon. The W.
end of Cuba has a good many of our
S. United States plants, those of the
pine-barrens - such as Lachnanthes
tinctoria, etc.
