

Madrid, Oct. 22, 1880

My dear Watson.

By the time this reaches you, I suppose you will be in Cambridge, & I long to hear what you have done. Grindale will give you news of us, and Jackson perhaps more. (*Oxytropis* revised).

A pleasant fortnight at Raspé almost a week in Paris, and then the journey down the Loire to Orléans & Tours, &c. & on to Burgos. We are here, stopping only at Burgos. We have had almost a week here, & have to-night for Toledo, then on to Cordova, Seville, Granada, &c. We have left behind all cold weather, find Madrid even rather too warm than cold. We have enjoyed much.

The Herbarium here does not help us much; possibly big records among unarranged things might yield a little more but I have done what I could in the time. The types of Cavanilles Lemo & his diss. are mostly here, fairly well preserved & carefully ticketed. Very many things of Me - who went everywhere - and a good many of Moquin Telle (only one or two from California & one - a Holcium - said to be from British - but, all unnamed or with unpublished or guessing names. Nothing has been done here, not an American plant named since Cavanilles or perhaps Lagasca - tho' I can get nothing I need named by him.

I send you a few notes, for preservation, in case my note book is lost. Select I select only the most important. -

Malva minima, Cav. really comes from Buenos Ayres. The wild specimen, clearly shown in the Pl. H. Matv. 1765, & put with it by Cav. is "cerro Pampas de Buenos Ayres", was cult. down to 1806, & 1825, & later years. Chile has same. It is the common & rather polymorphous Buenos-Ayres & Chilean species.

Virgilia secundiflora, Cav. is exactly the *Sophora secundiflora* species of Texas.

Cleome uniglandulosa, Cav. = the Texas pretty large form, larger than the common Texas - like the figure. Spec. cult. & a wild one "Scopulæ".

Gaura tripetala, Cav. = ours ^{or} Texas nat. nat.

Gaura mutabilis, Cav. = a real Gaura, by the fruit, like the plate. The fruit is that of Gaura inside. I have never seen it elsewhere.

Adonis Mexicana, Cav. = our plant of Calif. &

A. Virgata, Lag. ! Hellier, 1801
& 1807 = *A. linaria*, Nutt. = the one I thought in Tex. &c.

P. Linaria, Cav. ? Yes, in fruit also!

"*Nicotiana acillaris*" Moquin Torn.
Nov. 1781; the only one in the list of this set, must be the original of *N. ipomoeifolia* DC. Nutt. & is the one I have so called in H. & L.

Minthalia glutinosa, i.e. *Aster glutinosus*, Cav. is from Africa. Paper. Nov. H. Matv. 1792; a Mexico - but I doubt *Moica* = *glutinosa*. The other *Minthalia* are here.
