

Brussels, May 30, 1887

Mr. Watson

My dear Watson.

First, please thank Dr's
Gordale and Taylor, each for a
welcome letter, and say to the
former that I do not understand
that his beginning "Since"
my last, - this of May 9, is
the only one received from him.
I shall write one of these
days.

A pleasant visit to
Vienna & to Grazia, where
we rendezvoused with Mrs.
Gray's nieces, etc., a set
not most pleasant bearing this

name ungraciously,
I can only see the Mac. &
some forms of Polyp. & Gamopit.
No notes that we want to use in
Palmer, all to speak of.

344. Mystery Mexican, looks so
much like *M. canariensis* in flower
that it is probably Palmer's

"*Claytonia petiolaris* = *C. alisoides*
var. *rosea*, Brown has thick 4 not 2's
C. delica.

117. *Grimella polyandra*? I presume not
published. From size of flower might
be yours with delicate pink, but ripe
pink not red?

469. *Ranunculus edmonstonei* is an original
name & I did ^{not} know there are nearly 200
names of it.

525 - *Cacalia*. is one of the
new ones I sent down from Kew,
one with large heads & thick leaves,
But there is now lost in manuscript
it - and memory may deceive.

There are several others that
may be of some use hereafter

In Herb. Dr. I find
one thing for you to use
or consider in Palmer all,

For "Brickellia gigantea,
var.?" - a coarser species than
the gigantea & polycephala and broader
leaved. Substitute *B. reticula-*
ta, Gray. (Dr. Wright?) as it is the
B. reticulata, Dr. Wm. Wm.
Wright's *reticulata*, Dr. Wm. Wm.

268. I hope I am in time
for that. H.W.

Eupatorium this species plenum
Dr. Wm. W. is the proper
name of the L. (Heledium),
which without me, I think I could
not make out at Kew & sent
some notes about - Perhaps gave it
a name of its own - Large wide
ovate leaves & a few coarse &
rather large heads, glaucous - per-
hance pubescent, see Dr. -

Eupatorium microcephalum
My *Eupatorium microcephalum*
is *Artemisia ovatifolius* Dr. (Dr. Drake)
I think it is to be kept in Eupato-
rium rather than *Ophrysopanax*.
I will look at another when I
get home. Dr. gave me
a few good heads, - I send
these.

At Vienna I made
notes on such of Hooker's plates
as I required, did one more
- they have only a few & of
- families published by Barth - Mr
Compton &

You will probably soon
hear from us from Paris -
We are both well & happy
