THE CAMP,

SUNNINGDALE.

July 27, 1887

My dear Watson

Yours of the 11th reached
me two days since, and I
must send you a hasty line.
We have been here a few
days, and tomorrow we go to
bring up at Edinburgh.
I am even going to be on the road
at graduation day Sunday.

I have sent some postals
& parcels lately. I have
had a long day at Kew-
& ordered Delphiniums. &
some flowers at Port. Miss.
I. Kensington - where I saw
Mrs. Walter's Mark. - which
is less authentic & less
important than I thought.
The names put on are
mostly second-hand, & by French.

The "two copies" of Elements of
Botany addressed to me -
at Kew Herbarium have
not reached there. Dyer
is away. I cannot think
they went to his office.
But when I get ~~them~~
to Kew next, I will
enquire. Meantime I
have asked the Publisher
to send a half-dozen
copies to Trebner's for
me.

I have not found at
Kew any "copies of your
Contrib. XIV." Oliver
is now on vacation. They
may be in his drawer.
I shall hope to see them
in Aug. or Sept.
