a diminutive state. I do not wish the
specimens returned but would be glad to learn
their names. I found yesterday a
very wet meadow abundantly covered with Castilleja
coccinea, both the scarlet + the lemon yellow
flower bracts; the plants of the lemon yellow
flower I noticed were uniformly of a lighter
yellow green than the others that is the stems
& leaves. Seeing these grow in this clean
meadow I was at a loss to know on what
kind of a rock they could be parasitic.
I find that the word "Prunus"
is omitted from the Index of Manual.
