Dear Prof. Harlow.

Since my last letter I have made two collections of seaweeds and have added a number of species to my list. These I now send. All were growing except a few that were floating. Those found floating have that written on the under side of the cards. I have learned how to preserve the large seaweeds and can make good specimens out of them in all cases.

Specimens numbered from 89-114 were collected at Beacon Hill, Victoria about 200 yards farther north than where the collection was made on June 2. Specimens numbered from 115-123 were collected at Esquimalt half a mile east of where the collection was made May 30. Most of the small green specimens of this lot were collected in crevices of rocks near high tide.

Tomorrow I leave for Nanaimo about 10 miles from here where I hope to make large collections. Please address me at the Ottawa office. My letters will be forwarded. Very truly yours J. W. Macdonald
