Dear Sir

I just returned from the Country and the collection of California Ferns are nearly all made. I have found about 10 new species, which makes in all some 30 varieties, however, I have no dried fronds of 5 varieties; of all the others I preserved a lot of fronds and dried them, as well as could be done. There may be 500 to 600 fronds of the different kinds, all the way from 10 to 30 of each. It is difficult way out in the woods to preserve them and more trouble than it is worth. Please inform me how many you want for your Herbarium and what they are worth about. I rather dispose of the whole lot for anything to partly repay me for my trouble.
