My Dear Dr. Watson:

I am off on the Gallia tomorrow afternoon for three months. I have taken Rusby's collection with me - rather such parts of it as I have not had time to work out specifically, and plan to stay at Kew for a month or six weeks; afterwards we may travel a little. Prof. Coulter has asked for our Umbelliferæ which I have sent him at the cost of half a day's work - worth about \$25⁰⁰

to me at the present time. I have taken
the liberty of sending them in your care.
I think that this about winds that process
up. Whenever you want anything from here
you shall have it by regular mail or
express, but I rather think we shall
draw the line there, and whoever else
wants to see specimens can come here
for that purpose. By the way I have
requested Mrs. Bryton to send you anything
you want during ~~the summer~~ my absence.
I wish you a happy and pleasant
summer. Mrs. Bryton sends kind regards.
My address will be New York.
