You have of course seen Mr. Baker's "Gymnadiace" by this time. He is a wonderful worker and one of the most agreeable men I have ever had the fortune to be associated with. Oliver

I have also met most of the specialists
including both Bennetts, Dr. Masters
and C. B. Clarke with whom I daily
have long and learned powwow
over some poor sedge. He is making
terrible trouble in his work on the
Monographie volume. My poor little
Sierpus Pringlei has to go to the limbo
of synonymy as he says it is Breckle's
S. Schaffueri. I have not seen the
latter but thought I was safe from
the description. You probably have
Schaffuer's plant. Please look at them.
Likewise he has a much older name
for S. heterocarpus. I was afraid of
that when it turned up from Bolivia.
And Cyperus serrulatus is exactly
the real C. vegetus, Willd. But he is
as jolly as can be, and as I have brought
him five new species and let him name
them he thinks well of me I guess.
Mrs. Britton sends kind regards. Please

remember us both to Mrs. Gray.
There will be about 300 new things among
Rushby's collections from present indications.
