My Dear Sir Can you name
the plant by single leaf Enclosed. I
found it some weeks ago & liked it
so well that I bought some root houses & they
are growing fairly among my ferns. The leaf
being so peculiar I thought would be
sufficient to send you. The roots creep
just below surface of ground & have a
small tuft of these leaves on end.

I rec'd a package of 2 kinds Lycopodium
some time ago & am obliged to you
for it. Will you be able to send me
a full set & with names. I
ask me for some of the Compositae
with acuminate auricles. I found but
a single specimen last spring & have
been unable to find locality where I

discovered it. I have a little in my
growing which show a decided tendency
to lengthen the anthers. But do not know
where I got it as I have found
it from so many places. I have
found Captains Every time I have
found is a new piece of words
within 5 miles of the City. It is
almost plenty enough to be called
Common. I always find it in
moss around rocks. not limestone

I have a large lot of preserved
Charanthes. & shall be glad to send
you if you want any. or if you
want more living plants. It will be
a pleasure to me to send. I send
you a list with species marked
that I have plants of. I thought
you might put me in the way of
getting plants of some of those not
marked. Can you give me address
of parties who would be likely
to furnish, & paying for them of course
