My dear Sir. —

I enclose a small
portion of my small specimen
of *Frullania riparia*, Hampe.
(*F. aculeata*, Nees.) from No. Town, ^{Ver-}
mont, which may possibly
prove of interest. It is new to
the Vermont list and is not,
I think, common in the locality.

I found it upon rocks at base of limestone
dip at N. Point, the place you as-
sertively local flora - If it is of interest
you are welcome to it for the Club this time
or other disposition. Just now I am pulling
over a specimen from the mountains near
here that suggests *Manelia cuneiformis*, Lill.
but as not fixed I would not express a
great deal of certainty. ~~Do~~ I found
Rabdosia in *diversum* in the mountains
with other species new to me -
I had to pass you with any thing
I find of particular interest.
