

My dear Mr. Collins, -

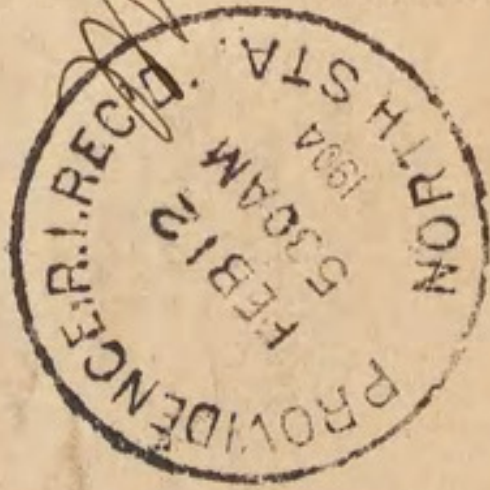
I am making fair progress

I have looked through the acutifolia
section and am beginning
the cuspidata. Specimens
collected from Cedar Swamp
Pond, Barreilleville, R. I., ^{in May, 1903}
are beautiful examples of
S. macrophyllum. I don't
think it has turned up previously
north of New Jersey, though
you may perhaps have a record
of it - a distinctly southern

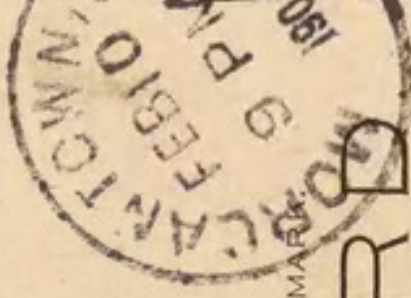
