I have heard from Mr. Joseph Hooker that the herbariums of mosses in the Gray Herbarium marked "Kew" were duplicates of the Schleicher collection purchased for Kew in 1880. The specimens were laid aside by Hooker and made into

sets by Lawson. Hooper says that  
"the specimens were collected by  
Geman botanists especially Brush  
& Bridel." This will explain  
the label you saw marked "Herb  
Bridel" and will also show that  
none of this set could have been  
into Herb. Tullivant although  
Tullivant may while alone have  
received similar specimens from  
Jeffreys himself. I think therefore that  
I had better put one specimen of each  
species in this set into Herb-Grey and distribute  
the rest. I shall put Hooper's ~~collected~~ into the "Archives"
