Dear Mr. Collins,

I meant to have answered your letter before I went to Thoracica for a few days to see about my house there and since my return it has escaped my memory.

It is very good of you to offer to let me have a part of your specimen of *Utricularia Taxonii*. I feel

that I ought not to let you rob yourself  
to supply me. I presume that a few  
leaves on an axis would be enough to  
enable one to recognize the species  
since Warnstorf's characters are  
generally based on cells of leaves and cortex  
only. I should be very glad to get a  
little bit but beg you not in any  
way to deface your own specimen.  
Knowing that you have a specimen,  
if I find it necessary to compare some  
Iphaxum which I suspect to be In  
Zaxonis, it will be very easy to send  
you my specimen to be compared with
