

Wilmington Vt 2 Oct 1903.

Dear Collins I landed from the steamer a week ago today & we came up here on Tuesday last to take advantage of the few remaining fine days.

I send you by mail a Bryum on the lichen which I have noticed for several years in the same place, but it seems to have fruited more freely this season than I have ever before seen it.

Its bright reddish color has made it often conspicuous on the ledge at our place only on the Lake shore road. I have not brought up any Moss Manual but I think this was gathered long ago by Mr E. Faxon for B. atropurpureum

this however is nothing but conjecture
or dim remembrance on my part.
We shall return to Blue Hill
on Monday eve next. I was
sorry to lose the Club meeting
but it seemed best to take a
few days up here. Hoping you
are all well, I am
