The mosses about here are now taking a little of my attention. Nothing exciting has thus far materialized. I have been anxious to go onto these Elizabeth Islands and see if sea influences could be traced. Thus far I have no clear clue. The Floridan Dicran sabuletorum R.C. coming up to New Jersey is here on these sandy uplands and even in the woods of Naushon Island in considerable abundance.

I hope the package has come to hand safely.
