My dear Sir:-

Mr. Long has asked me to send you some specimens of the Cacharina cispa which I collected here last fall. I am sorry to have to say that my moss-collecting has been of a quite desultory and accidental sort and that, having no idea that I had a prize, I collected but little of this particular species. I send you, however, a couple of fragments now: later, when the plants are more mature, I will try to get you more and better material.

I have found C. cispa at two stations in this town, about a mile apart - in both cases on sandy, partially shaded banks at the margins of a water-course. Very likely a careful search would reveal considerably more of it in the sandy swamps of this locality.
