Dear Mr. Schweinfurth:

I wish to thank you for the long list of orchid determinations, and for the named specimens that you returned. I have no doubt that the lists, now being sent to Brenes, will cause much rejoicing in San José, and I hope result in the arrival of further collections from that direction.

This evening I mailed you the first section of the proof of the orchid part of the Flora of Costa Rica. I expect the rest will follow rather rapidly. I have looked over some of the orchid part, and find that for some reason the compositors have made more mistakes than usual. Generally their work is very good--all the printing is done in the Museum building.

It will be some time yet before the first part of the Flora is issued, for it goes through the Begoniaceae, and even farther if I get time to write up additional groups, but it is likely that they will begin running the publication on the press before long, since the printing office is anxious to get some of its type released.
