We have our customary accumulation of Central American orchids--I guess there are 50 or more of them, and mostly collected in Costa Rica by Austin Smith. At least, they are good specimens, and there are duplicates of some of them. We have just purchased some 1600 of his specimens, with a goodly number of new records for the country.

If we may impose again upon your kindness, we should like very much to have this new material named. If you are willing to undertake it, I shall have it sent on before I leave for Guatemala, which I hope will be the sixteenth of next month.
