Dear Louis-

Last week, I returned from my first field trip to prepare my next one into the Putumayo. I wrote from my field trip to Dugand when I got your letter about publication in Caldasia. Today Dr. Dugand asks me if I heard from you, for he says he has written airmail to you concerning the matter. This is a bit urgent since he has been good enough to reserve for you 8 pages (including plates if you have drawings) for the next issue. He says there are only 15 daysⁱⁿ which he can hold these pages. I told him I owed you a letter so would write today. He is very anxious for your collaboration, & I think whatever you send will be carefully published. Dugand once owned a large printing shop in Barranquilla, so he is familiar with printing problems. If you do not have ready enough material for 8 pages, he says to send what you have & the pages of Caldasia will be open in future issues.

We got quite a number of interesting orchids from the Venezuelan border, considering the off season. Some may possibly be new, as the mountains are completely isolated.

This afternoon, I get my presses from the Museum; they arrived during my last field trip.

Could you send me a reprint of Pachyphyllum Schultesii?
