Dear Dr. Kennedy

Many thanks for the floral
illustrations. Which have reached me this
morning. The photographs and accounts of plants have
made me quite familiar with them so
that it seems as if I had been there almost
and your comparison with Senggele's Botch - It. when
I have been there makes it still more so -

We are just home from two weeks trip to Hawaii
Palau when we have made large collections and I
found quite a number of new species - leaves &
fruits. But in fruit it looks & less rough than in Cuba

and the roads being good - on ~~traveled~~ by carriage
most of the time and ~~therefore~~ did not ~~travelling~~
which was not good for us - for we did not
eat as well or feel as well as in Cuba.

The water is lovely in color & clearness almost
happier & the vegetation much like that of
Indiana - much coral rock - pine lands &
patches of hard wood - "coppits" or "hammocks"

as they are called - I hope that you are
quite well and enjoying this delightful Fall
