of plants to defray my ex-
penses on this trip.

Shall have from two to four hundred rare or critical species to supply, including some of the rarest in St. and N. E.

My terms are \$7.00 per hundred or less than a hundred 10¢ per sheet. Plants guaranteed to be first class, according to our modern ideas of herbarium material.

Will you take a set, and can you tell me of others who might? Your son-in-law, Mr. Briggs, of Lebanon, N.H., helped me get Hecanthobium jucundum last spring, this spring I have found two stations near Rutland, the first in Vermont.
