Dear Dr. Kennedy,

A week ago

Saturday afternoon

took your boxes with

certainly deliver your  
boxes during the  
week even if he had  
nothing else to make

and the clerk said  
they had not, as they  
had no other things  
to send. I told them  
that they must  
wait no longer as I  
had agreed to pay for  
a whole team load &  
they did not have  
other things to send.

They promised to  
send them certainly  
on Thursday. If they  
do not reach you  
all night on Thursday  
with you please let  
me know.
