Some curious combination of circumstances we were kept from meeting each other before I left for Cuba. I wanted to see you and Mrs Kennedy, but could not bring it about.

Francis and I have been in Cuba for about a fortnight and we are now facing homeward. We found the Harvard Experimental Station at Sóledad, near Cienfuegos, in good condition, needing only a few suggestions to make its work still better. Mr. Cameron, who has been journeying in the British West Indies, met me at Sóledad & is to take

the Saturday steamer with us to N.Y.

We are having a wet time here; in some places the Tobacco crop is ruined in quality, but most of it will go into Vuelta abajo Cigars, all the same!

Havana now is a beautiful city, fairly clean and very full of sights, so we are now busy with camera and walks.

I hope that the new year will be to you all a very happy one.

Francis has gone out to get some paper, & do some other shopping in Spanish for practice. If he were here he would join me in sending to you all very sincere regards.
